# Street signs are in place on Miller beach

After several years of effort, the MCC Shoreline Committee has finally obtained and installed **street signs on the beach side of all 18 access points** between Montgomery St. and Wells St. The signs will enable beach-goers to report exactly where they are on the beach, if they need to call 911 for assistance from police, medical or water rescue personnel. You can now relax on the beach, knowing that, in case of emergency, help is on the way and the helpers can find you. John Pickford has arranged for making the street signs without charge, and the MCC has accepted responsibility for having them set in concrete, at a cost of about \$1,700. Since the MCC had worked so hard to get the signs made, we felt we had to see that they were installed.

## Maintain Marquette park

Following the renovation, Mayor Freeman-Wilson claims that Gary can manage and maintain Marquette Park, even though most people recognize that the city does not have the resources to handle this responsibility. Luckily, the Miller people who care for the park are willing to devote their personal effort to keep the park looking good, despite the absence of city manpower. Currently, the city has assigned a half person to handle park upkeep, and their part-time employee is a good worker who responds quickly to fix problems when they are identified. However, what keeps the park looking good is the hours and hours of (free) volunteer labor.

Shoreline Committee chairman Carol Smith is the leader of a volunteer squad that comes out several times a week to pick up trash from the park. Smith also leads monthly work days to do planting and weeding around Fr. Marquette's statue. She is aided by Chester Baran, who mows the lawn in that area. Meanwhile, members of the Miller Garden Club, led by Sue Rutsen, take care of the gardens inside and outside of the Aquatorium. If you are willing to help in this effort, you are welcome to stroll through the park any time and pick up whatever rubbish you find.

# .. and use Marquette Park

This summer, the park is especially inviting for visitors. Carmella Saraceno is operating the concession stand near Montgomery Street as **Carmella's Café**, serving breakfast from 6:00 until 10:00 daily, and lunch all day long. The café offers a beautiful place to sit and relax next to the beach, while enjoying a variety of food options. At the adjacent parking lot, there is no charge for parking up to 10:00 am, and after that, patrons of the café can park free for a half hour.

In addition, the Gary Park Department has scheduled a succession of activities in the park:

**DRIVE-IN THEATER BY THE LAKE is** back **the first Friday of each month** through October. The first presentation, on **June 6**, features the movies *Frozen* and *Hunger Games*. The gate opens at 7:00 and the show starts at dusk. There is an "inflatable fun" area and concession vendors. Cost is \$10 per car or \$15 for a van or truck.

**WINE TASTING**. The **Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority** is having a wine-tasting fundraiser with music by SayYes, at the Aquatorium, on **Friday, June 13**, from 7:00 to 10:00 pm. Cost in advance is \$20 or \$25 at the door. For information call 219-718-5545.

**JAZZ ON THE LAGOON** will be Up Close and Personal on Thursday, June 26. Doors open at 6:30, music starts at 7:30 pm. Cost is \$25 in advance or \$30 at the door. For information call 746-7374 or 938-7362.

**CLEAN WATER FESTIVAL** on **Saturday, June 28** from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm will offer youth outdoor games, fishing education, canoeing, biking, creative arts, and other presentations. Admission is **free**. The festival can celebrate the fact that the water in the park really is clean.

### But, follow the rules . . .

Gary's public beach stretches from the US Steel breakwater to County Line Road. IN THE WATER. boats (including jetskis) are allowed to run at full speed parallel to the shore only when they are outside the line of buoys. The bathing beach is Marquette Park, from approximately Grand Blvd to Montgomery St. In this area, boats are not allowed inside the buoys, and lifeguards are on duty daily from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm from Memorial Day to Labor Day, to protect the swimmers. In the swimming area, children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. The rest of the lakefront is a boating beach, where boats are allowed to come inside the buoys at idling speed and perpendicular to the shore. The Lake Street area is a boating beach with a lifeguard on duty to protect the boaters. At the rest of the beach, swimmers may enter the water inside the buoys at their own risk. (In the water, boaters are permitted to possess and consume alcoholic beverages, but boat operators must be sober, just like motor vehicle drivers.)

ON THE BEACH, the rule is no alcohol, no glass containers, no littering, and no open fires or grills. Pets are not allowed in the bathing area, and in other areas they must be on a leash. Owners must clean up after their pets. Place rubbish in the trash cans which are provided.

If there is a problem on the beach or in the water (or even suspicious activity), **call 911** to summon law enforcement or emergency rescue personnel. This number communicates directly with the dispatcher, who will send help. This year, the Gary Police beach patrol is better equipped to communicate with the dispatch center. The non-emergency number is 881-1260, but it should not be used if you really want help to come.
